Chromebooks

50 new student chromebooks arrived at school the other day. These were purchased by the Board to further extend our digital capability in the classrooms and we will get these into the hands of the students as soon as we can. I'm grateful that the BOT supports the use of technology to support learning in the school and we will be working very hard to embed responsible and creative use of the technology in the school.



Playground

The people have spoken! After the Board and PTA authorised the funds to be spent I gave the students a say in what they would like to add to the Junior playground after we had to remove the old steel slide and fireman's pole under Health and Safety. They overwhelmingly voted for a custom made 'corkscrew' slide and this will be accompanied by a climbing wall. I have ordered the equipment and it should be installed within 6 weeks.

My thanks to the PTA for donating their raised funds to make this happen. Over time we will replace the playground completely and these new items will be transferred to that, but in the meantime the children will have some exciting new additions while we busily raise the required funds. At the moment the playground looks a bit uninviting.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L)

Gordonton is starting this programme in 2019. It is a global way of dealing with behaviour that centres around restorative practices, relationships all encompassing values. It will replace the old 'Rights and Responsibilities' model and look at dealing with behaviour in the school in a positive manner. This is not a soft option by any stretch and the children will do a lot of learning around what a value looks like in practice. I've used it in other schools and it works if everyone commits to it.

I attended a Principal's workshop on this model last week and was impressed at the content. Our teachers are doing their first training session tonight at a staff meeting the programme requires a 3 year commitment from the school and is very well funded.




Student Leaders



The meeting for EOTC originally scheduled for this Wednesday Has been postponed until the following Wednesday (27th Feb) as I am unavailable on this day.




HELP PLEASE
