Ag Day NOTICE

An update about Ag Day 2021 - at this stage we are planning for it to go ahead under Level 2 conditions. Unfortunately this means that if we are at Level 2 on 22 October it won't quite be the big school-wide community and fundraising event we had hoped it would be due to event number restrictions, but it will still provide our children with all the same opportunities for them to demonstrate the Ag Day and school values of commitment, responsibility and motivation (and creativity for those entering the Virtual Pet and/or Grow & Bake sections!).

Agricultural Club (Calves, Lambs & Goats)

Once we know numbers of children attending we will be able to plan for and advise how the event may look at Level 2 - ie. whether we need to restrict adult spectators to one per family etc to stay within Government guidelines. We are yet to hear from the Group Day Committee what, if any, changes may be required for the actual judging of the events.

If we are still at Level 2, this part of Ag Day will either have to be restricted to children only viewing the exhibits, or parents may be able to attend at staggered times to stay within the 50 person at an indoor limit - these details are yet to be fully discussed and considered but we will keep you updated as much as we can about how the day may run.


Hi all.
