#### **Rugby Cards**

Recently there has been a resurgence in interest in collecting rugby cards and bringing them to school. These are the free cards from cereal packets and depict various All Blacks and their bio-information. They or various iterations of them over the years, have been enthusiastically collected by children - mostly but not exclusively young boys - and brought to school for swapping, trading or just proudly showing off.

Sadly, there is a negative aspect where these items becoming something of a currency for the *collector* community and as commonly happens some children - without thought of manaakitanga and ngakau pono, help themselves to other children's cards. I've never been too draconian when it comes to these items coming into school and have usually adopted an "at your own risk" approach, however, when items start getting stolen it is time to intervene.

I have spoken to the students about this matter. From today these cards are not to be brought to school. If children insist on bringing them they will be retained and returned at the end of the day.

There are other items that come to school that are not intended for the purpose of learning or safety such as bey blades and other toys. Children bring these to school at their own risk and it would be wise to only bring things to school that benefit learning or safety.

#### **Board of Trustees**

Also on tonight's calendar is the final Board of Trustees meeting of the year where we wrap up the Governance for 2019. I will present our school-wide achievement data to the Board and I will be able to share it with the community thereafter in subsequent newsletters. I would like to acknowledge Shona Enersen and the Board for their awhina and hard work this year, some of them entering the role at the mid year elections.

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
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
