This week in New Zealand's Historic past:

- **10 May 1897** NZ's first woman barrister and solicitor appointed.
- 11 May 1945 Charles Upham presented with first Victoria Cross New Zealand's most-decorated soldier, Charles Upham, received the first of his two VCs for outstanding gallantry and leadership during the Battle of Crete in 194.
- 12 May 1971 Anti-Vietnam War protests in Auckland. Anti-war protesters disrupted a civic reception in Auckland for New Zealand soldiers returning from the Vietnam War.
- 13 May 1936 New Zealand National
 Party founded after the crushing defeat
 of all opposition by the Labour Party in
 1935. It would be another 11 years
 before National formed a Government.
- 14 May 1907 Plunket Society formed.

 Dr Frederic Truby King helped form the Society for the Promotion of the Health of Women and Children at a meeting in Dunedin Town Hall. The society, soon known as the Plunket Society after Lady Victoria Plunket, the wife of the Governor at the time.
- 15 May 1901 Nicholas Oates appeared in the Christchurch Magistrate's Court charged with driving 'a motor car within the city at a speed greater than four miles an hour' (6.5 km/hr) on Lincoln Road, Christchurch.
- 16 May 1981 All Whites beat Australia on road to Spain. The New Zealand football team's famous 2-0 victory in Sydney was a defining moment in their epic qualifying campaign for the 1982 World Cup finals. (Ricky Herbert who appears elsewhere in this Newsletter played in that Team).


