Pool - community use over summer

Work is progressing toward making this a reality. We will be installing a porta-loo down in the pool area for the summer as the absence of a toilet has made it difficult for the pool to be used in the past. It was decided this was a far superior and economic option than constructing a permanent facility down there which would have cost around \$10,000! Keys will be cut ready for issue and pool will have a new lock to match. These will be numbered keys and those wishing to use the pool over the summer outside school hours will be asked to pay a fee for a key which will be assigned against their names as well as sign a pool use agreement. Part of that fee will be in the form of a refundable deposit upon the keys return. The exact fee has yet to be finalised. With the increased use of pool chemicals the fee will only cover the cost of extra chlorination and consumables.

With heightened traffic through the pool there is an increased need for water quality testing and adjustment. Two local school dads have kindly stepped forward and offered to be trained by Blair to carry out this daily task. More on this later as the figures are finalised.

Air Conditioning

Staff and Children in Rooms 1 - 6 won't know themselves this summer as we are currently having air conditioning units installed in those classrooms.

The Board of Trustees have authorised the installation after class temperatures reached 35 deg Celsius on the warmest days last summer. Teachers and children enthusiastically collected temperature data over time which I was able to present to the Board. I thank them for their commitment to making our learning environments comfortable and healthy for our Tamariki and Staff.

New Appointment

I am now able to inform you that the newly appointed teacher for the year 3/4 team for 2020 is Jennifer Adam. Jennifer comes to us from Rototuna Primary where she taught at a similar level. She has high level strengths in Maths and has led this curriculum area with success. She is an experienced classroom practitioner with superior capability in sports coaching across a range of codes including cricket and netball. Along with Education she has a degree in Sports and Leisure as well as strengths in dance and the performing arts.

We welcome Jennifer to Gordonton in 2020.


