Perhaps we will see some of these on Friday.



Hi from the Board

GORDONTON SCHOOL BULL CALF FUNDRAISER

Hi all.

I am now taking registrations for the Gordonton School calf fundraiser. Some of us are now nearing calving, so it's time to put one or two aside for the school. With the risk of Mycoplasma Bovis still upon us, the calves will not be able to come here as they have done traditionally in the past before sale day. So ideally they could be sold with your own stock if possible or alternatively the truck will come and collect directly from individual farms.

We think this is an easy and simple way for our community to support Gordonton school. All this requires is raising a bull calf to 100kgs this spring. We will also be doing a virtual calf for those non farmers that would like to support us and unable to rear a calf.

We need our children to get the best out of their school. So 100% of all proceeds raised go directly to improve Gordonton School in areas where the Ministry of Education do not put money into or not enough.

We have an opportunity for a person motivated and passionate for farming to help run our 78ha milking platform farm and occasionally help on the 64ha runoff. This is drive in only position – there is NO accommodation available with this position. Primary roles are milking and feeding cows, with other farm jobs.

You will need to have

- · Good organisational skill and show initiative
- · Capable and safe when using machinery
- Excellent animal husbandry skills
- Able to work efficiently without supervision
- Able to work well with others
- Keen to listen and learn
- Fluent in English
- Have a valid drivers licence

We run a split milking system, 370 cross-bred cows (at the peak) currently producing 170,000 – 180,000 kgMS. We are between Whitikahu and Tauhei (20mins NE of Hamilton and 15mins NW of Morrinsville) on consolidated peat. The owner will be hands on in busy times and you will be required to work closely with the farm owner and the farm consultant, both of whom will provide guidance and mentoring when required. We try as much as possible to create a work/life balance. We have a great record as employers with a previous employee being with us for 14 years.
